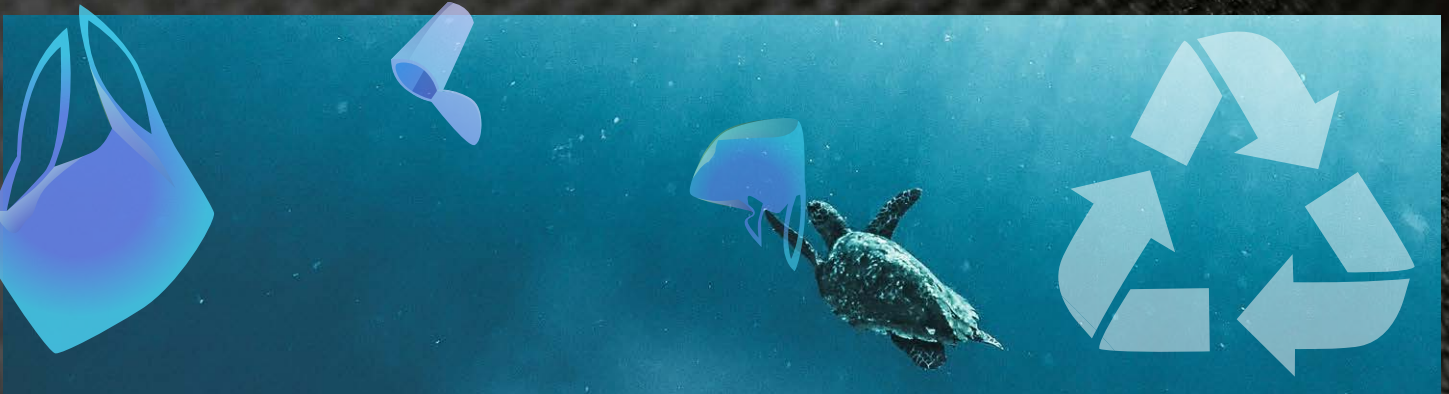

Gildan has translated the Gildan Quality System (GQS) into a website on Genuine Responsibility. With their facilities and manufacturing, Gildan aims to implement industry-leading environmental, social and governance measures at every stage of the process. Ethical trading and improving working conditions in global supply chains; that is what Sedex is committed to. Gildan is a member of this service provider.



Cotton Council International (CCI) is a non-profit trading association promoting American cotton fibers and cotton products worldwide with the Cotton USA trademark. Gildan is licensed for Cotton USA, which means the cotton in their products is from American soil and the products contain more than 50% cotton.



Gildan's articles and materials have been tested on harmful substances. Clothing with the Oeko-Tex-100 certification meets the legal safety and quality standards. This means tested and certified textile products do not contain unsafe pollutants. Gildan must continuously monitor the quality of the supply chain through this quality mark in order to guarantee safety.



The Sustainable Apparel Coalition focuses on sustainable production in the clothing, shoe and home textile industry. The alliance primarily focuses on the Higg Index, a standardized supply chain measurement tool. This allows all participants to provide insight into and interpret the impact of their production on the environment, as well as working and social conditions. This allows urgent matters to be solved, which companies could never change independently.



WRAP stands for Worldwide Responsible Accredited Production. It's the world's largest independent certification program, focusing on social compliance for the sewn products industry. WRAP is based on twelve principles ensuring basic working conditions are understood and implemented in factories. The monitoring is carried out by third parties, so it's independently established for Gildan that the brand complies with WRAP.
